GRANTS FOR UNIVERSITY PRE-ACCELERATOR PROGRAMS

Supporting university-based startup entrepreneurs and the creation of new Victorian startups





BACKGROUND

The Victorian startup ecosystem has undergone significant growth in the past 7 years, with the number of startups more than tripling from 1,000 to over 3,500. However, there's potential for even more growth with other ecosystems supporting many more startups which return higher economic growth. It is therefore imperative that we continue to support the creation of new startups in Victoria.

Previous experience has shown that pre-accelerator programs are a key drivers of startup creation, providing aspiring entrepreneurs with access to support, advice and networks to help them on their journey as they build their new companies. For the purpose of this grant round, LaunchVic defines a pre-accelerator as a new program which supports entrepreneurs at the beginning of their journey.

With over 420,000 current Victorian university students, we see a big opportunity to increase the reach and quality of on-campus pre-accelerator programs. We've seen some our biggest success stories come from student entrepreneurs; examples include Airwallex, Acusensus, Mindset Health and Tixel. However, more than 115,000 students in Victoria do not currently even have access to on-campus pre-accelerator programs.

LaunchVic has already supported 24 pre-accelerator programs in a range of sectors and we are now looking to support the establishment of pre-accelerators in university environments to boost startup creation.

OVERVIEW & OBJECTIVE

LaunchVic is seeking to fund the establishment of high-quality Pre-Accelerator Programs delivered by Victorian-based Universities to support aspiring startup entrepreneurs.

The successfully funded University Pre-Accelerator Programs will:

- Support startup entrepreneurs by helping them bring their startup idea to life and create an MVP; and
- Increase the pipeline of startups being created across Victoria.

This Project will give Victorian Universities the opportunity to apply for funding to develop a greater entrepreneurship focus within the university, and deliver a pre-accelerator program.

Applicants will need to demonstrate a clear need or gap within their university ecosystem, have demonstrable experience growing startups and startup communities (or commit to working with delivery partner/s who do), and request grant funding for a pre-accelerator program that can realistically help aspiring founders to start and grow startups.



DEFINITIONS

The below definitions apply to this Grant Round:

Pre-Accelerator is a new program targeted at Startup Entrepreneurs who have a technology-based idea for a startup, want to establish a business and develop a Minimum Viable Product (MVP). The program runs for a designated period (a minimum of 6-weeks), and participants 'graduate' from the program having followed a set methodology to establish a startup. A Pre-Accelerator program can provide a pathway to an Accelerator program.

Startups are defined by LaunchVic as an innovative, technology-based business that can scale rapidly and capture mass markets. Examples of technology-based businesses include: software and application development (Artificial Intelligence (AI), blockchain, big data analytics, e-commerce or marketplaces, augmented or virtual reality, Software as a Service (SaaS)), hardware, advanced manufacturing, sensor technology, robotics, autonomous vehicles, quantum technology, deep tech, and genomics and life sciences (including biotech & medtech). Once a startup has demonstrated accelerated growth sufficiently it becomes a scaleup.

Startup Entrepreneurs are individuals who have an idea for a technology-based Startup and are seeking to launch a Startup and register their new Company via ASIC in the State of Victoria.

Victorian University Students are studying at a Victorian University and currently reside in the state of Victoria. A student completing their degree online who resides outside of Victoria is not considered a Victorian University Student.

Operating Costs include staff salaries, rent, event costs, insurance, accounting and legal costs, marketing and promotion costs, reasonable domestic travel costs, grants to startups and other reasonable operating costs.



ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must satisfy the following eligibility criterion:

- Program Focus The proposed program must be a new Pre-Accelerator program. The program
 must primarily support Victorian University students and research teams who are aspiring
 Startup Entrepreneurs (over the age of 18). We are not providing funds directly to Startups or
 Startup Entrepreneurs through this Grant Round.
- 2. **Applicant Experience** Applicants that are eligible include a delivery team that has proven expertise in supporting early-stage technology startups to launch and grow. Where there is no current delivery team, applicants must outline a clear plan to recruit these key personnel or intended collaborations with experienced delivery teams/partners.
- 3. **Type of Organisation** Applicants must be a Victorian University as listed on the Live In Melbourne website: https://liveinmelbourne.vic.gov.au/live/education-and-childcare/victorian-universities

While dual-sector universities are eligible to apply, dedicated TAFE and other research institutes are not eligible to apply.

- 4. **Grant Amount** Applications up to \$400,000 (exclusive of GST) over a minimum of two years are eligible.
- 5. **Matched contribution** is required for the program with a minimum expectation of cash or inkind funding from the lead applicant to match the Grant.
- 6. **Application submission** must be via the <u>LaunchVic online application system</u> before the closing date and time to be eligible.

KEY ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Applicants are required to address the following Key Assessment Criteria via the LaunchVic online application system. Included below are the required responses and the maximum word count for responses.

ASSESSMENT AND SELECTION

Applications must be submitted via the <u>LaunchVic online application system</u> by the specified deadline.

Eligible applications will be assessed against the Key Assessment Criteria by an Assessment Panel comprising at least three LaunchVic personnel. LaunchVic may appoint an external expert to the Assessment Panel. Applications that do not meet the eligibility criteria will not be assessed.

Interview: Shortlisted applicants will be required to attend an interview with the Assessment Panel. Applicants may be required to provide additional information as part of the application process.

LaunchVic may enter negotiations with shortlisted applicants to refine project proposals. Funding outcomes are ultimately determined by the LaunchVic Board and their decision is final.

Information provided will be kept strictly confidential.

All applications are made at the applicants' own cost and will not be reimbursed, whether the application is successful or unsuccessful.

LaunchVic is under no obligation to award a grant, however we expect to award 4 grants under these Grant Round Guidelines. We are unlikely to fund more than 1 grant per university however multiple applications from the same university are welcome. Where quality permits, preference may be given to universities who do not currently have any pre-accelerator programs.



CONTRACT

Successful applicants will be required to enter a legal contract (Grant Agreement) with LaunchVic and provide project reporting and evidence of project progress against KPIs (such as number of Participants and number of new Companies registered in Victoria via ASIC) to receive payments under agreed milestones. Approximately 15 percent of the total grant is allocated to milestone 1 and contracts typically include approximately five to seven milestones. The number of milestones, and amounts, are determined by LaunchVic and are dependent on factors such as the funding amount, scope and length of project.

APPLICATION FORM

Applicants will be required to address Eligibility Criteria and provide Applicant Information including: Organisational Details, Key Contact and Secondary Contact. Applicants will also need to provide Project Details as outlined above. Applicants will also need to address Key Assessment Criteria and complete the Declaration before submission.
